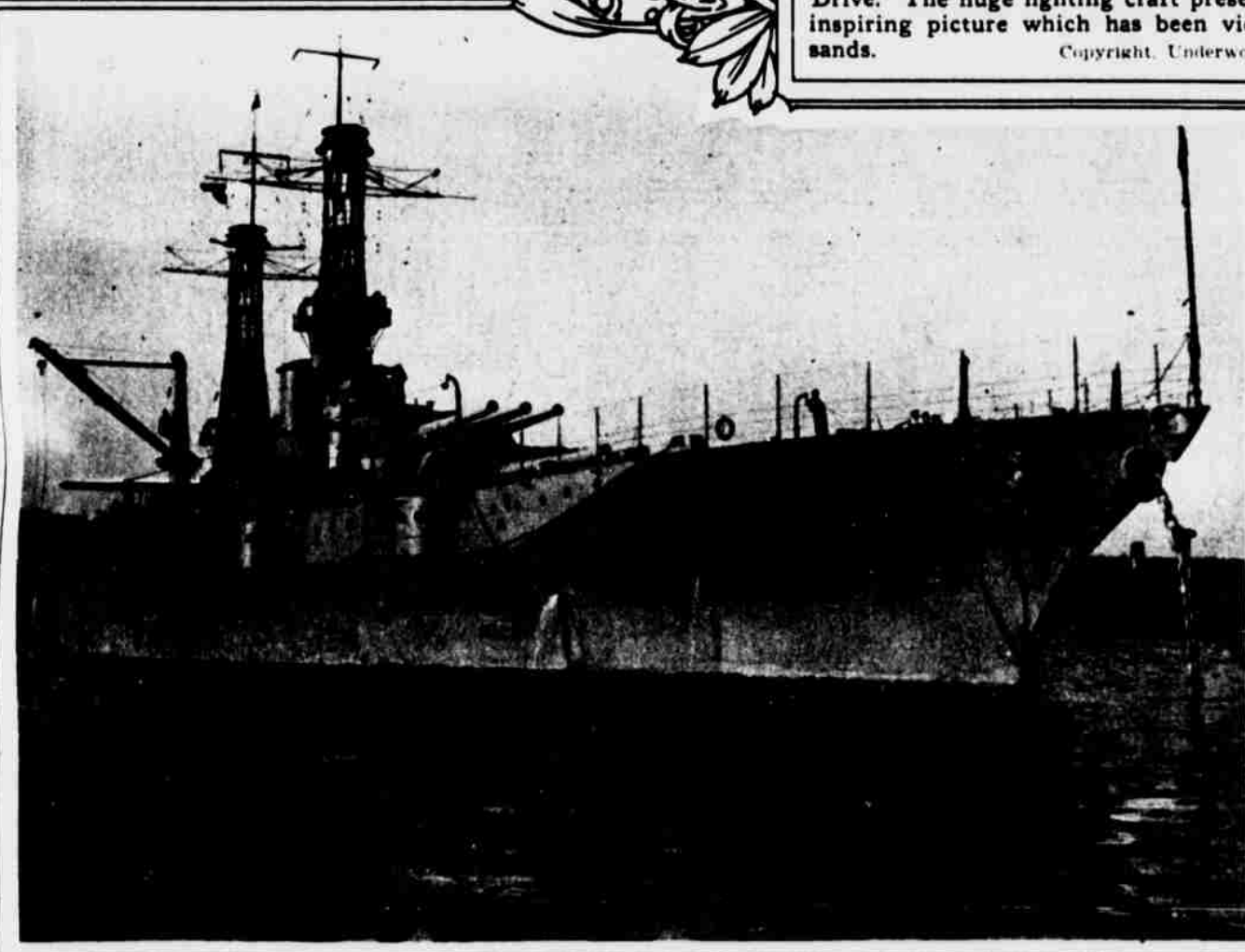

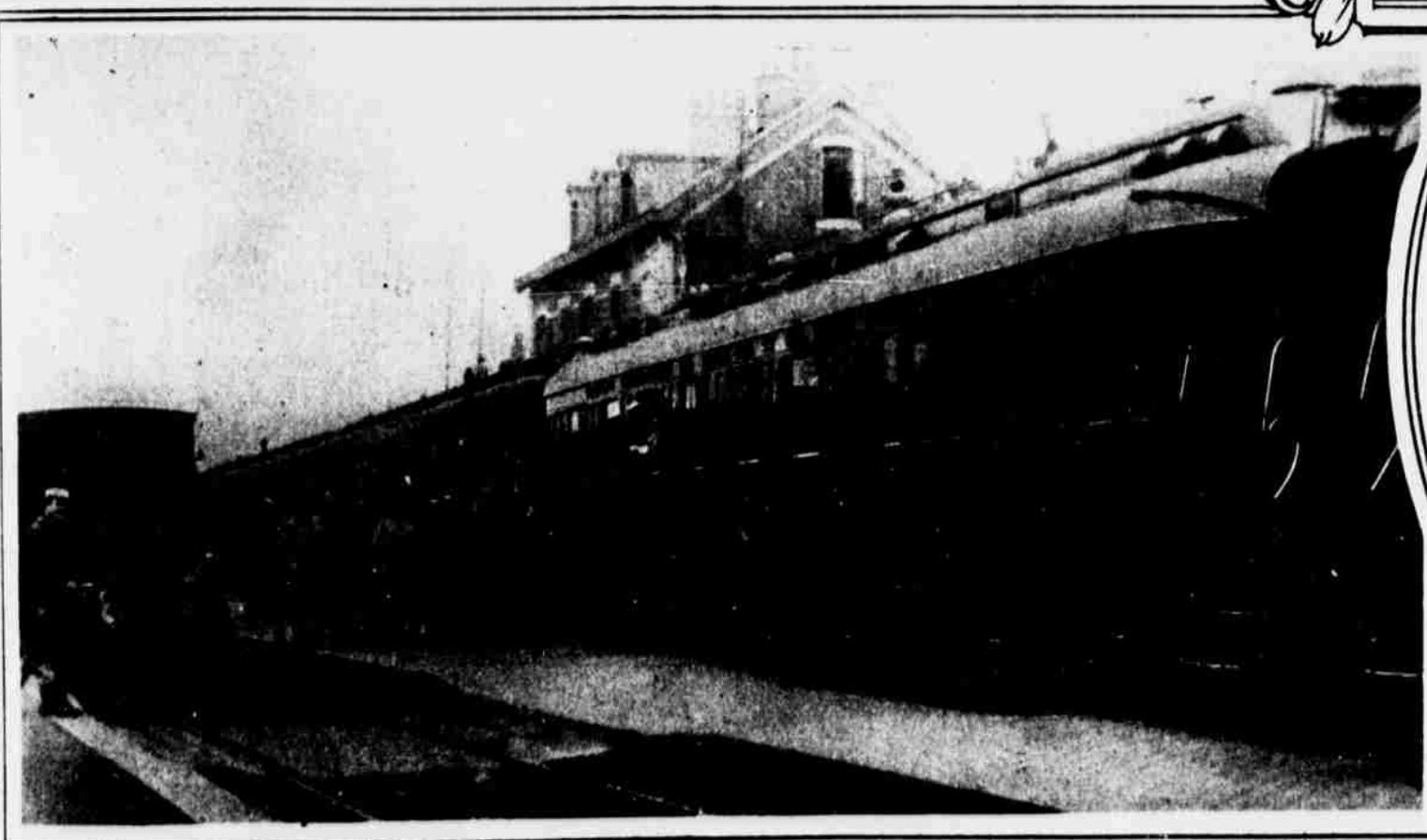

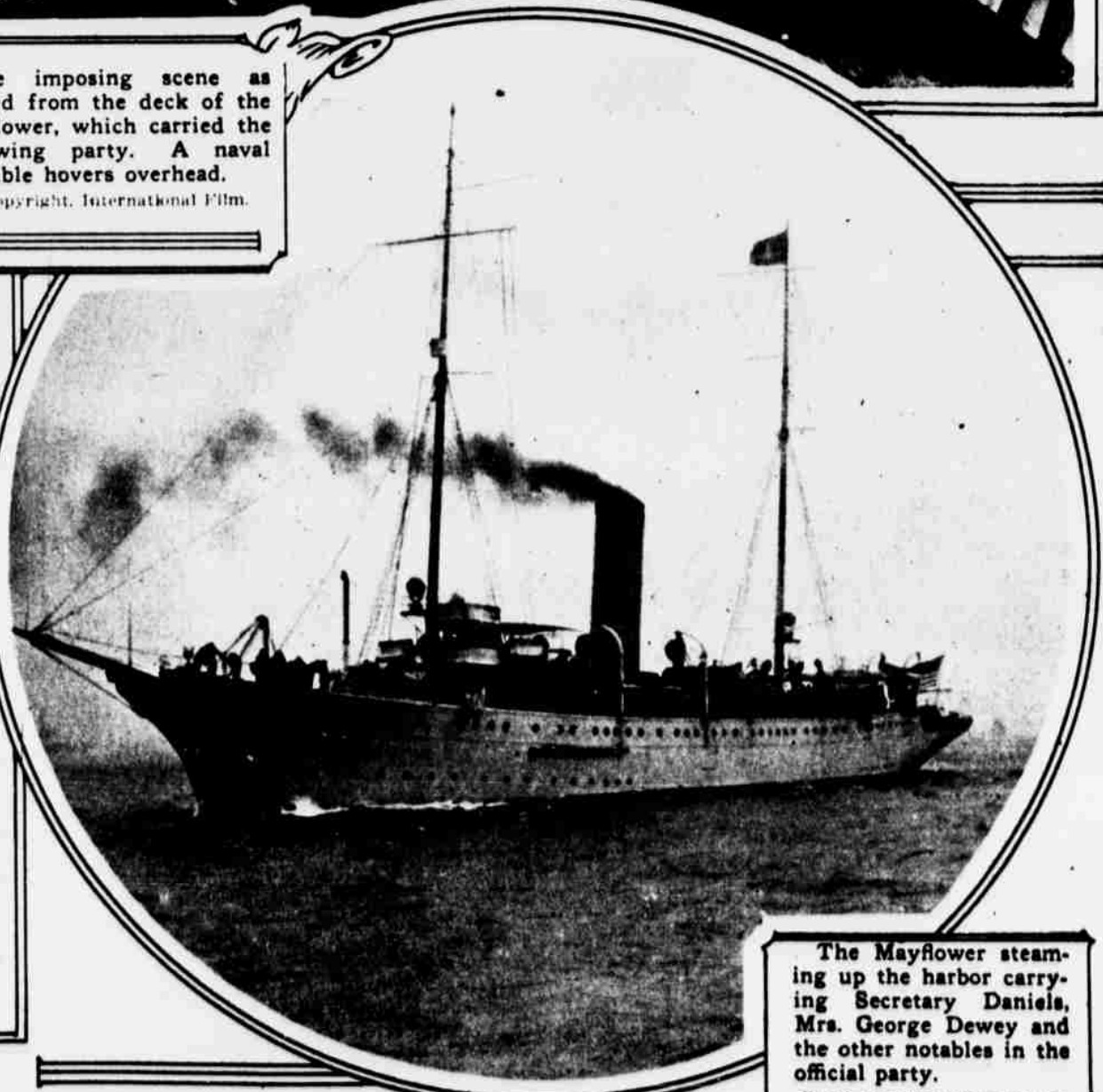
The imposing scene as viewed from the deck of the Mayflower, which carried the reviewing party. A naval dirigible hovers overhead.
