

WARSHIP GEORGIA MAKES RECORD RUN

New Sea Fighter Easily Fastest in the Navy.

MAINTAINS GREAT SPEED

Conditions for the Run Were Favorable
and Officials Are Jubilant Over
Success.

Navy officials are jubilant over the success of the official speed trial of the new battleship Georgia, off Portland, Me., yesterday, when the newest addition to the navy, named in honor of the Palmetto State, demonstrated herself to be easily the fastest ship of all, even outrunning the swiftest new ships. The Georgia maintained a speed of 19.25 knots an hour for four consecutive hours, on the official endurance run, the test being made over a rough course. As the vessel was contracted for 19 knots, she not only exceeded by more than a quarter of a knot the speed required, but easily established herself as the fastest battleship of the navy. Her record exceeds by .26 knots that of the New Jersey, which was made off the New England coast March 23, that being the best previous showing made by any American vessel in the battleship class.

Better Than Builder's Trial.

This was even somewhat more satisfactory than the ship's builder's trial, which was run Wednesday over the government measured mile course, off Bath. The first trial showed that 15.9 revolutions of the propeller per minute would develop the contract speed required. The average attained yesterday was 12.23 revolutions.

Conditions for the run were favorable, according to advices received at the Navy Department. The first hour out was the best, the record being 19.33 knots. In the second hour, 19.27 knots was recorded. In the third, and 19.20 in the fourth.

During the last hour the supply of picked coal was exhausted, and ordinary coal was used. Consequently, the speed for the final hour was reduced, bringing the average down considerably.

Crews Were Landed.

The battleship was taken into the Portland harbor after the trial, and the naval trial boards and the spare crew were landed. The members of the trial board are expected in Washington this afternoon, and their detailed report on the work of the Georgia is anxiously awaited, particularly by the officials of the Bureau of Navigation and Construction and Repair.

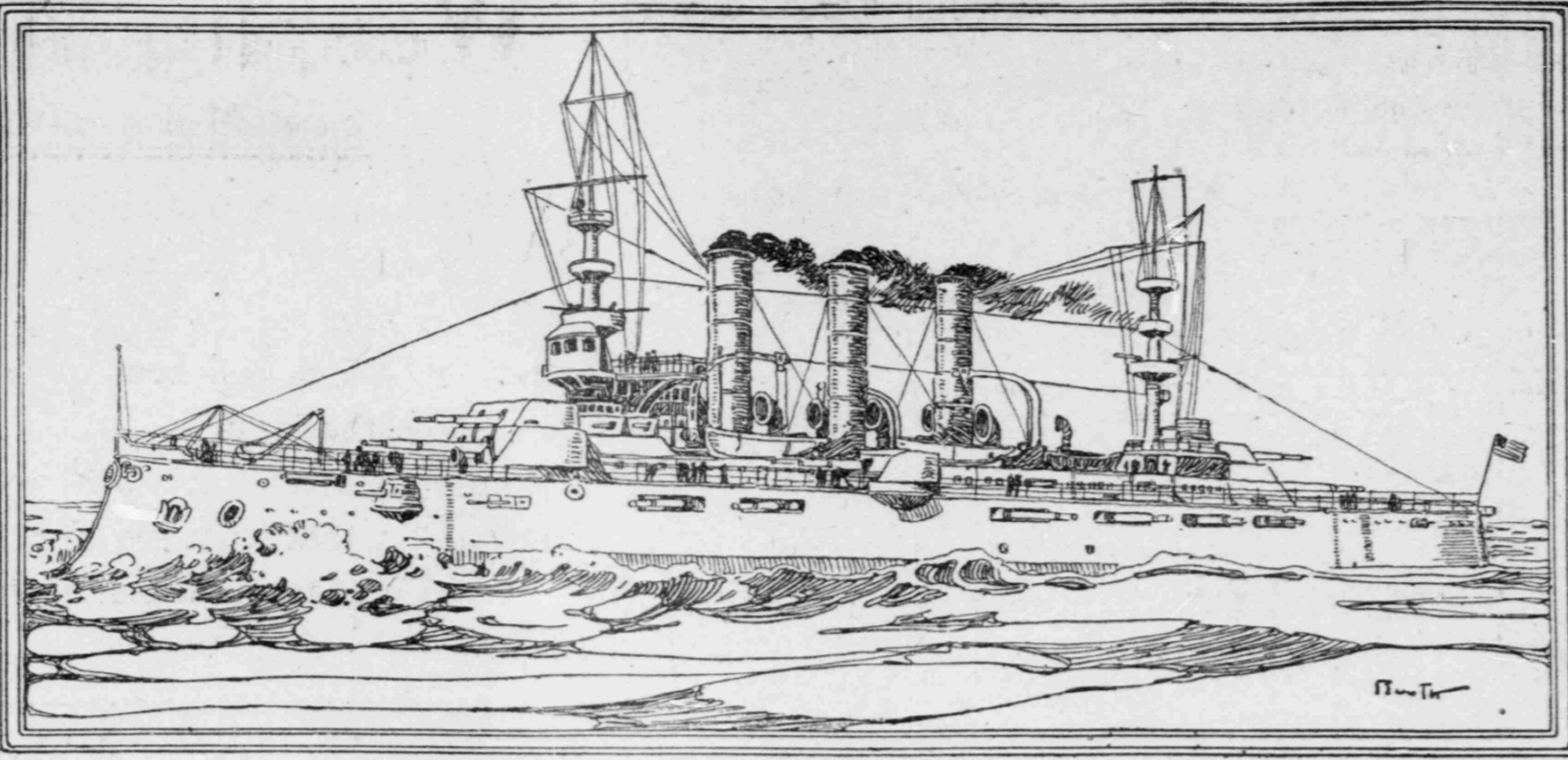

PHOTOGRAPH AFRICA WITH A BIOSCOPE

Expedition Starts From Cape Colony With Cameras and Miles of Films.

LONDON, June 15.—Armed with bioscope cameras and miles of films, a British expedition is starting out to traverse the Dark Continent from the Cape to Cairo.

The party has a commission from the Zoological Society to bring home a white rhinoceros and any other rare animal they can capture alive.

Braving the hostility of the central African natives, the expedition will push forward to the mysterious capital of Nyassaland, which no white man ever has penetrated. By posing as magicians and by distributing presents they hope to gain access, and to take pictures of life in the forbidden city.
