GIRLSLAITS BANDIT AS HE ROBBS A SAFE

Police Find Ruffian Under Iron Box With Knife in His Heart.

New York, October 30.—Those policemen of the Harlem stations who, during the last three years have predicted a sudden and violent end of the career of Frank, otherwise known as "Chick" Monaco...

Nellie Lenere, twenty years old, in a statement made to an assistant district attorney last night, declared that she had killed the man while he was attempting to rob the safe which belonged to her mother.

Monaco was twenty-four years old, and was known all through the foreign quarter of Harlem as the " survivor of a triumvirate which had consisted of himself and "Tough Tony" and "Black Galucci," both killed within a month, one in a wine shop and the other by a policeman's bullet.

Not Afraid of Robber. Wherever he was known he was feared, but Nellie Lenere snapped her fingers in disdain last night when it was suggested to her that terror rather than concern for her mother's money must have moved her arm.

The girl went to the East One Hundred and Fourth Street Station yesterday afternoon, and in a voice that was almost casual told Lieutenant Lasky that a young man had "met with an accident" at her home, 239 East One Hundred and Ninth Street, and that he had, perhaps, better send a policeman there with her.

Lieutenant Lasky listened until he had ascertained that "Chick" Monaco was the person in need of succor, and then ordered Policemen McDonough, Lennon and Hauser to betake themselves to the house with all possible speed.

The police found Monaco lying on his back with a heavy iron safe across his chest. He had been cut in six places and had died from a fatal thrust of a long knife, the hilt of which stood upright at his head. His arms were bent behind his head and were pinned under him.

"I thrust them there," said the girl quietly. "I was afraid he would lift the safe in his struggle, for he was very strong. But, as you see, the safe was too heavy after all" and besides I acted quickly."

Later to Assistant District Attorney Strong Miss Lenere dictated a statement and signed it.

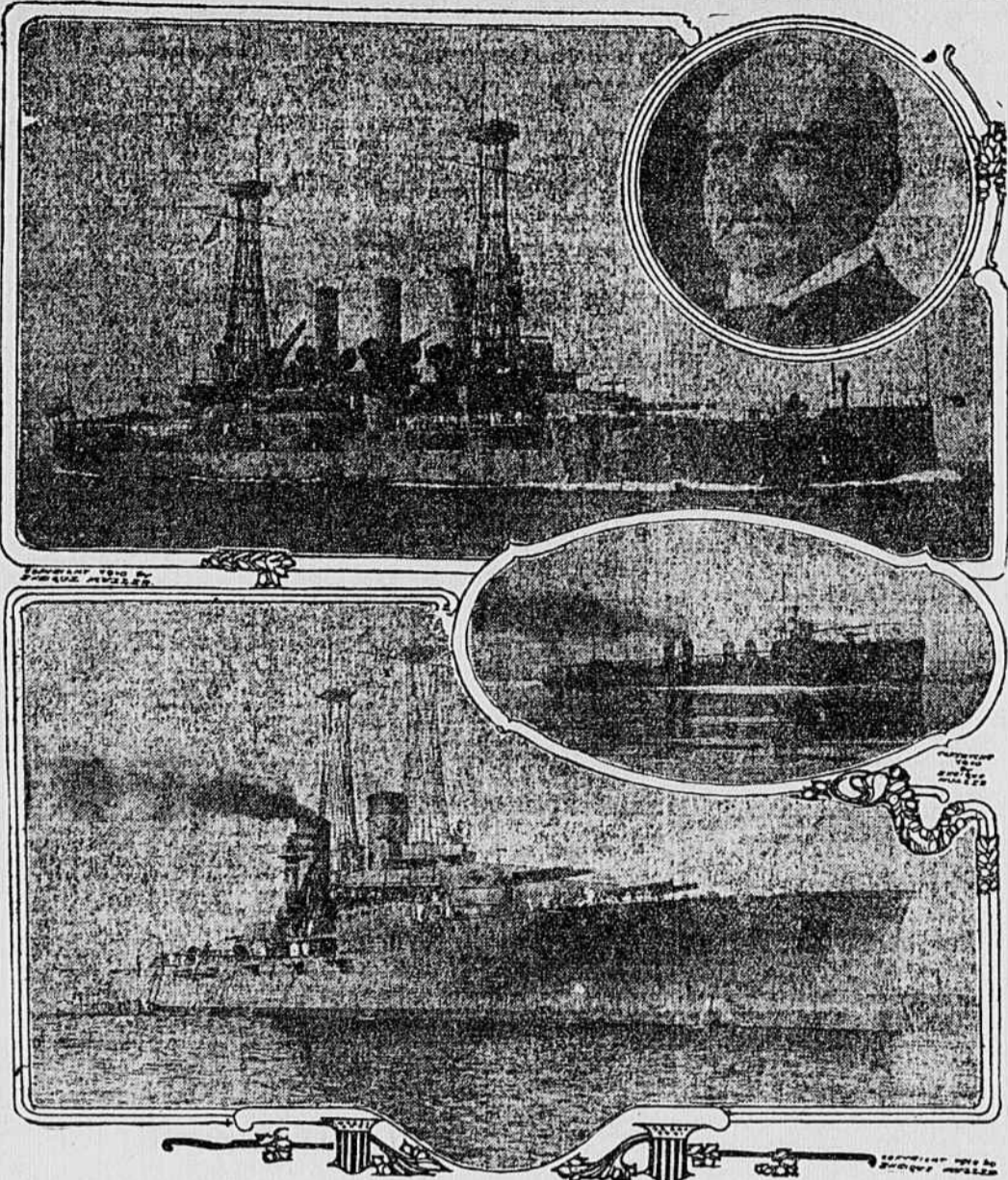
Had Robbed Her of \$350. The girl's story began with when she was married to Gaetano Napolitano, in 1909, at the City Hall. She had expected a church ceremony after the civil one, according to the custom of her country, but Napolitano had gone away and she found herself a laughing stock.

More than two years went by, and one day last month Monaco visited her. He told her that her husband was very ill in a village near West Chester, and desired to be married to her by a priest before he died. She would need to take \$350.

She declared that she went to West Chester with Monaco, who, after taking her money, locked her in a lonely cottage and fled.

Monaco reappeared yesterday while she was alone at the home of her parents. He told her she must call off the police and then spring the safe ordered her to open it. She refused
