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ACCUSE DRUGGIST OF SPITE AGAINST PASTOR RICHESON

Pastor Will Deny That He Ever Purchased Poison, as Hahn Declares.

NEW GIRL WITNESS.

Says Avis Linnell Told Her of "Walk With Richeson" on Day of Her Death.

(Special from a Staff Correspondent of The Evening World.) BOSTON, Oct. 25.—When the special Grand Jury investigating the death of Avis Linnell by cyanide poisoning, for which Rev. Clarence V. T. Richeson is held on a charge of murder, resumes its inquisition Monday morning, a new witness and one whose testimony is expected to go far toward securing an indictment of the young minister, will be presented by District-Attorney Pelletier.

This witness, a young woman whose name is being guarded by the police, will testify that she met Miss Linnell the afternoon of Saturday, Oct. 14, at 4 o'clock, or about three hours before the girl's death, and that Miss Linnell said she had just been walking with Richeson.

On its face this testimony would appear one of the most important bits of evidence secured by the authorities since the statement of Druggist Hahn, who sold Richeson the cyanide at his Newton Center drug store the Tuesday before Miss Linnell's death.

NOTED AMERICANS IN TRAIN COLLISION ON ENGLISH ROAD

All on Boat Express, Rushing to Meet Lusitania at Liverpool, Escape Injury.

LONDON, Oct. 25.—The American boat train, which left Euston Station at noon today filled with Americans and other passengers for the steamer Lusitania, sailing from Liverpool for New York, ran into the Trent Valley local train at Colwich, about six miles south of Stafford, at 2.30 o'clock.

None of the passengers on the boat train was injured, but three of those on the local train were hurt, two seriously and the third slightly.

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23 NEAR DEATH IN CAR COLLISION AT L. I. CROSSING

Electric Locomotive Carries Away Rear Platform of Trolley, Then Speeds on

A matter of a few feet in the progress of a trolley car saved the lives of a number of its passengers when it was struck by a Long Island Railroad electric locomotive at Metropolitan and Flushing avenues, on the boundary line between Brooklyn and Queens, today.

There were twenty-two men passengers and one woman in the car and only two were injured. This was because all the car but the rear platform had cleared the track upon which the locomotive was running.

The car was one of the Metropolitan Avenue line, bound from St. John's Cemetery to the Williamsburg Bridge Plaza in Brooklyn. At 6 o'clock it approached the Metropolitan Avenue grade crossing of the Long Island Railroad at Flushing Avenue.

This is a bad crossing but there is no flagman there between 7 o'clock at night and 7 o'clock in the morning.

Conductors of trolley cars crossing at night are required to go to the railroad tracks and signal their cars to proceed when they are sure the road is clear.

ALL CLEAR, CONDUCTOR SIGNALS AFTER LOOKING.

George Malloy, conductor of the Metropolitan Avenue car, followed this rule today. There was nothing in sight on the Long Island Railroad tracks. He signalled the motorman and then stepped across the tracks to wait for the car on the other side of the crossing.

There were four men on the rear platform of the car. One of them happened to glance down the railroad track as the car was clattering over the rails and saw the headlight and misty bulk of an electric locomotive approaching.

ENGINEER KEEPS ON WITHOUT KNOWING OF COLLISION.
