DANIELS LAUDS Y. M. C. A. WORK

Tells Membership Workers They Have Higher Duty Here Than Elsewhere. SECURE 118 ADDITIONS

Ford Team Has Best Day's Record. Total Numbers 232—Judge Barber Praises Boys' Department.

The Y. M. C. A. is of more importance in Washington than in any other city in the country, declared Secretary of the Navy Daniels last night at the banquet of workers in the big membership campaign now being conducted by the local Young Men's Christian Association.

"Washington belongs to everybody, to every citizen of the republic," explained the speaker, who was the guest of honor of the occasion. We all are proud of it whether we live in North Carolina or in Maine.

TRACTION OFFICIALS MEET HERE TODAY

President Wilson Will Address Their Annual Midwinter Gathering at Willard This Afternoon.

Officials of nearly every electric railway line in the United States arrived in Washington yesterday to attend the sixth annual mid-winter meeting of the American Electric Railway Association, which opens in the assembly rooms of the Willard Hotel this morning.

The keynote of the initial session will be "Public Service and Publicity." Among those who will speak at the morning session are Col. T. S. Williams, of the Brooklyn Rapid Transit Company; Guy E. Trippe, chairman of the board of directors of the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company, and M. C. Bush, of the Edison Electric Company.

President Wilson will be the principal speaker at 2:30 o'clock. The day's meeting will conclude with a joint banquet of the American Electric Railway Association and the American Electric Railway Manufacturers' Association in the Willard tonight.

RAILWAY COMMON FAVORITE.

Interest on Local Exchange Switches from Preferred Stock.

Washington Railway and Electric common was the featured issue on the Washington Stock Exchange yesterday in place of the same company's preferred stock, the demand for which gave the market stimulus during the first few days of this week.

There was no extensive trading in railway preferred. The price fell off to 2 1/2 from 3 1/2 on four sales of single shares. Then shares of Capital Traction at 95, the minimum, was the only other sale made on the stock list yesterday. Sales from the bond list were on \$1,000 Capital Traction 7 at 106 1/2, a Washington Railway and Electric 4 at 81 and one Riggs Realty (long) 5 at 101.

MCKINLEY GRADUATES WATCH MOVIE SCENE

Thirty-three Students Get "Sheepskins" in Ceremony in School. Thurston Delivers Address.

In the presence of several hundred of their relatives and friends, the superintendent of schools, Ernest L. Thurston, and members of the board of education, thirty-three students of McKinley Manual Training School were graduated in the school hall last night. Mr. Thurston, who delivered an address to the graduates, wished them success in the business of life, and expressed the hope that they would prove themselves worthy citizens of the District.

The program, unlike usual graduation exercises, consisted principally in motion pictures of an expedition into the wilds of Alaska, made by the Alaskan engineering commission to establish the boundary of the United States. The pictures were shown by Thomas Riggs, Jr., a member of the commission, who accompanied the expedition. The exercises were opened with an invocation by Rev. H. Barmore Angus, Mr. Thurston and William T. Galliber, who presented the diplomas, were introduced by Henry P. Blair, president of the board of education. Several musical numbers were delivered by the school orchestra, under the direction of D. Wolf.

DISTRICT COMMITTEE FAVORS 'JIM CROW' CAR

House Body Orders Clark Bill Favorably Reported—Stiff Penalties for Violations.

The House District Committee yesterday ordered a favorable report on the Clark bill, which provides for "Jim Crow" street cars in the National Capital. The measure would become effective four months after its passage.

The bill stipulates that the car companies shall furnish either separate cars or separate compartments for white and colored passengers. It provides for a fine of \$500 a day for each violation of the act, one-half of the amount going to the person instituting the suit and the other half to the District government.

The act also would penalize the active head of such offending companies by the imposition of a fine ranging from \$500 to \$1,000 or jail terms of from three to six months.
