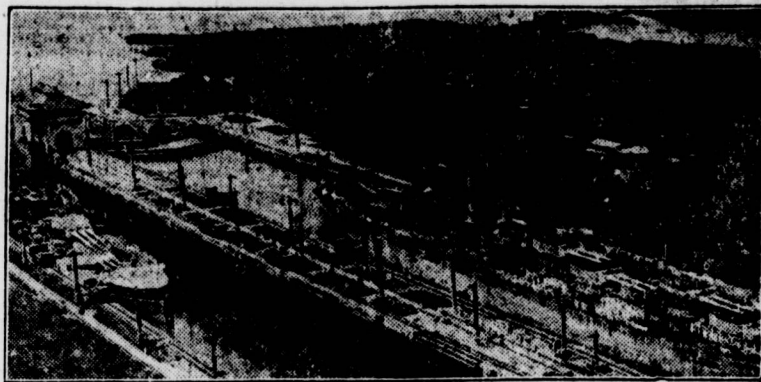

THE U. S. NAVY Passing Through the Canal.



The U. S. S. Wyoming and the U. S. S. New Mexico are shown here passing through the Pedro Miguel locks of the Panama Canal.

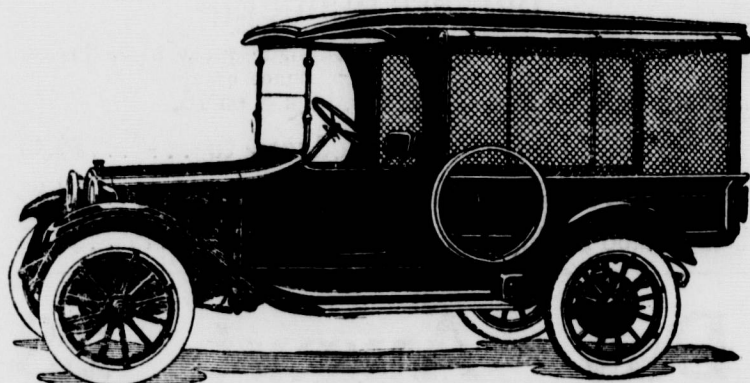

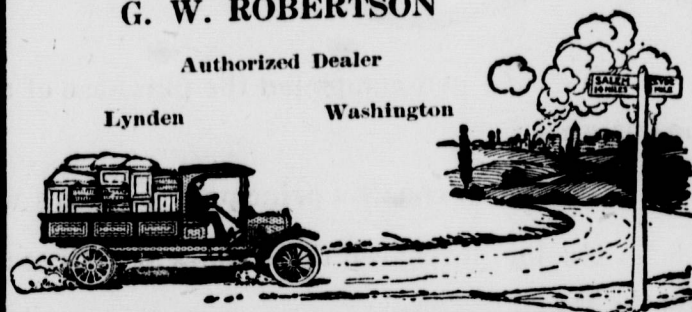
