DEPUTIES OF ITALY SUPPORT ORLANDO

Chamber of Deputies Votes Confidence in Cabinet by Count of 382 to 40, Latter Votes Being Cast by Socialists.

BALLOTING FOLLOWS ADDRESS BY PREMIER

Italian Delegation Can Now Return to Paris With Increased Authority, Is View of Roman Newspapers.

Rome, Thursday, April 29.—Premier Orlando's government has given an unambiguous vote of confidence in the Italian senate tonight, following the vote of confidence given him by the house of deputies.

Rome, April 29.—The Chamber of Deputies tonight voted confidence in the cabinet by a count of 382 to 40, the latter votes being cast by socialists.

The vote followed an address by Premier Orlando in the chamber. Former Premier Giolitti followed the premier and was also unanimously applauded, except by the intrapartisan socialists.

Now the Italian delegation can return to Paris with increased authority to continue peace negotiations. The dominant note in the present cabinet of confidence given in the chamber tonight.

The premier and his cabinet proclaimed the details of his address for Paris and the declaration of war against the socialist party.

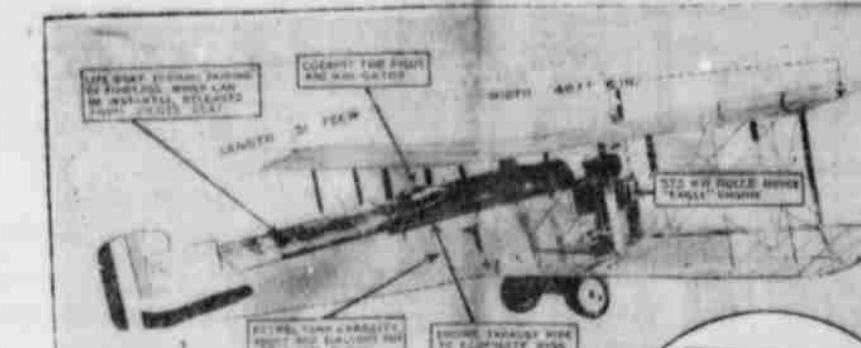
The premier also spoke of the attitude taken at Paris by the British and French governments which he said had been loyal to the peace cause.

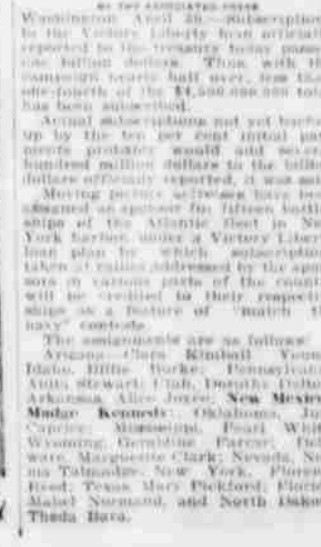

EXPLOSIVES INTENDED FOR ROCKEFELLER AND BURLESON UNEARTHED
