

al board of the Young Women's Christian association is raising \$4,000,000 for war work among women. This amount is expected to be enough to cover their expenses until next June. If it is not sufficent, more will be raised. Mrs. S. W. French is council member for Arizona.

Most of the sum will be spent in our own country on women affected by the war. The soldiers' women folks appreciate the hostess houses in the military camps, for which \$900,000 is being spent. Thousands of girl munition workers and new government employes would have no decent place to sleep and no proper food were it not for the \$500,000 the war council has appropriated for their needs.

For colored women's protection and assistance \$200,000 has been appropriated. Another \$100,000 will be spent looking after women who cannot speak English and cannot therefor look after themselves.

Very prominent women have this great undertaking in hand. Mrs. Jas. Stewart Cushman of New York is chairman of the executive committee of the war work council. The vice chairmen are Mrs. John R. Molt of Montelair, N. J., and Mrs. John Moigs of Pottstown, Pa. Mrs. Henry P.
