JOHN DRISCOLL, 82 years old, said to be the sole survivor of the U. S. S. Monitor, famous for its victory over the Confederate ironclad Merrimac, died yesterday in the United States Naval Home at Philadelphia. Infirmities of age caused his death.

JOHN O'BRIEN, for fifteen years Receiver of Taxes in New Rochelle, died there Sunday at his home, aged 67.

AMOS F. HOLDEN, head of the Holden Paper Company, died Saturday at his home in Newburg, N. Y., in his seventy-second year.
