## Vice Admiral DeWolfe Miller III



Vice Admiral DeWolfe Miller is a native of Annapolis, Maryland and grew up in York, Pennsylvania. He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1981. He holds a Master of Science from the National Defense University, is a Syracuse University national security management fellow and is a graduate of the Navy's Nuclear Power Program.

His operational assignments include Training Squadron (VT) 19 "Attack Frogs" in Meridian, Mississippi; Attack Squadron (VA) 56 "Champions" aboard USS <u>Midway</u> (CV 41); Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 25 "Fist of the Fleet" on USS <u>Constellation</u> (CV 64); VFA-131 "Wildcats" and VFA-34 "Blue Blasters" both aboard USS <u>Dwight D. Eisenhower</u> (CVN 69); executive officer of USS <u>Carl Vinson</u> (CVN 70); commanding officer of USS <u>Nashville</u> (LPD 13); commanding officer of USS <u>George H.W. Bush</u> (CVN 77) and as a flag officer, commander of Carrier Strike Group (CSG) 2 participating in combat Operations <u>Enduring Freedom</u> and <u>Iraqi Resolve</u>.

Miller's shore tours include Air Test and Evaluation Squadron (VX) 5 "Vampires;" aviation programs analyst Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (OPNAV N80); Strike Fighter Weapons School Atlantic; deputy director of naval operations at the Combined Air Operations Center during Operation *Allied Force*; Office of Legislative Affairs for the Secretary of Defense; aircraft carrier requirements officer for Commander, Naval Air Forces; and flag officer tours in OPNAV as director for Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (N2N6F2); assistant deputy chief of naval operations for Warfare Systems (N9B); and his last Pentagon assignment as director, Air Warfare (N98).

Miller became Naval Aviation's 8th "Air Boss" in January 2018 and retired in December 2020.
