

TWO KILLED IN SAVING CORPSE

While Fire was Raging Around Mourners at Bier of Mrs. Gilligan, Five Remained Behind to Carry Out the Body.

FOUGHT WAY THROUGH STIFLING SMOKE.

Michael Stafford and Charles Burley Stuck to Their Posts and for Their Heroism Forfeited Their Lives.

DEAD AND INJURED IN FIRE AT WAKE.

DEAD. Michael Stafford, seventy-eight years old, No. 87 First street, Brooklyn, smothered. Charles Burley, twenty-three years old, No. 241 West street, Brooklyn, smothered. INJURED. John Gilligan, twenty-two years old, No. 87 First street, Brooklyn, head, face and hands badly burned. Alfred Wynn, twenty-seven years old, No. 40 First street, Brooklyn, hands and face burned.

Two men lost their lives to-day and two others were burned, one seriously, while rescuing the corpse of Mrs. Mary Gilligan from the burning house at No. 87 First street, Brooklyn.

The coffin-carriers had reached the sidewalk when Michael Stafford, seventy-eight years old, and Charles Burley, twenty-three, collapsed from smoke, and before medical aid could be given to them they choked to death. A moment later a son of the dead woman, John Gilligan, whose face, head and arms were badly burned, sank unconscious on the street. It was thought that the smoke which filled his lungs would end his life on the spot, but Surgeon Rossiter, of the Long Island College Hospital, revived him.

Upper Candle Staged Fire. A wake was being held for Mrs. Gilligan when the fire started, a high candle at the head of the corpse toppling over and igniting the curtains on the window of the front room and some draperies.

There were about twenty men and women present, mourning relatives and neighbors, some of whom had come in from the house of Dominic Doherty, at No. 91, where another wake was in progress for a boy who had died from rabies. Before any of them could do anything the flames had gained such proportions that the women were taken to the street and five of the men remained behind to carry out the body.

Dominic Doherty and John Gilligan led the rescuers, and Alfred Wynn, Charles Burley and old Michael Stafford helped to lift the heavy body. By the time the house was aflame and smoke filled the passageway which led from the Gilligan apartment on the first floor to the front door.

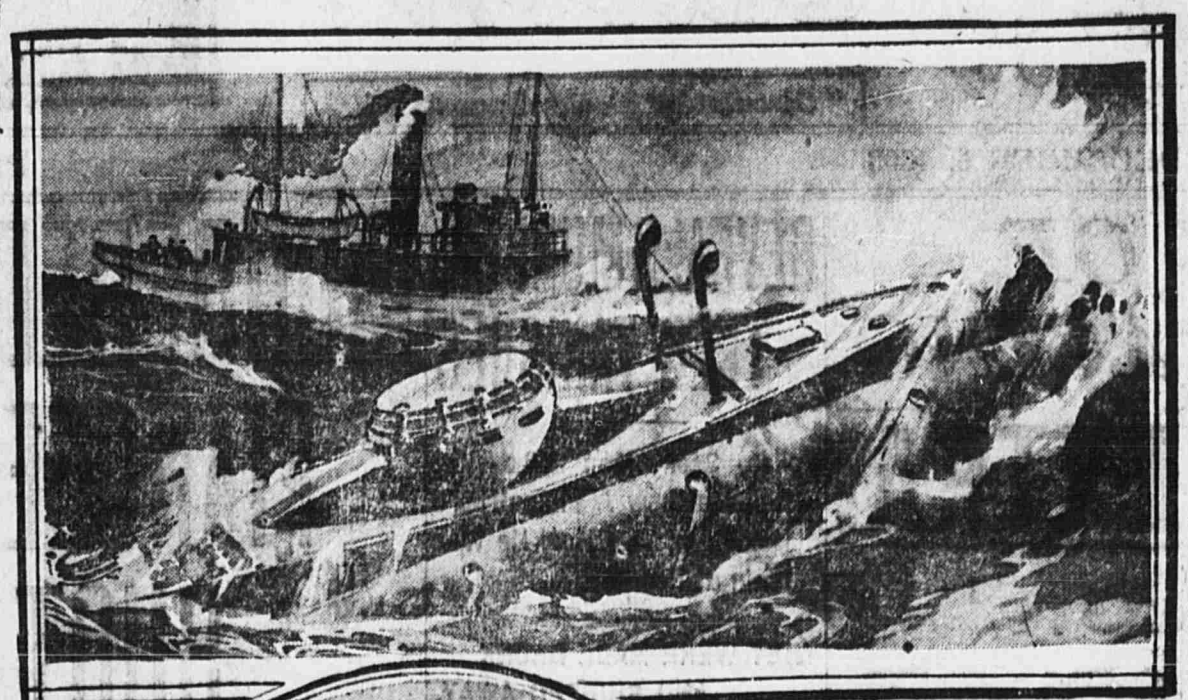
Fire writhed around them, but none let go his hold. Burley and Stafford were the last to reach the fresh air. It had been too much for them to hold their breaths and they had inhaled the deadly fire and smoke.

Saved Whole Family. When Doherty got to safety he remembered that he had seen nothing of the Logan family, which lived on the second floor of the two-story frame structure, and fighting his way back he reached them and dragged them down the stairs—father, mother and four children. Not one of the Logans sustained as much as a scratch and Doherty's hands were only slightly burned. Firemen marvelled how he escaped.

Young Gilligan is reported to be in a serious condition at the Long Island College Hospital. He and another brother and the old mother, who is dead, had lived alone in the home which was destroyed. Mrs. Gilligan died on Thursday last.

Gilligan revived sufficiently to tell the following story: "My mother died of cancer of the stomach. The wake began at 7 o'clock last night and kept up until very late. I fell asleep while the people were still there. This morning I was awakened by the fire and saw six or seven men struggling to the doors in the front and rear of the house. Then I tried to escape, too."

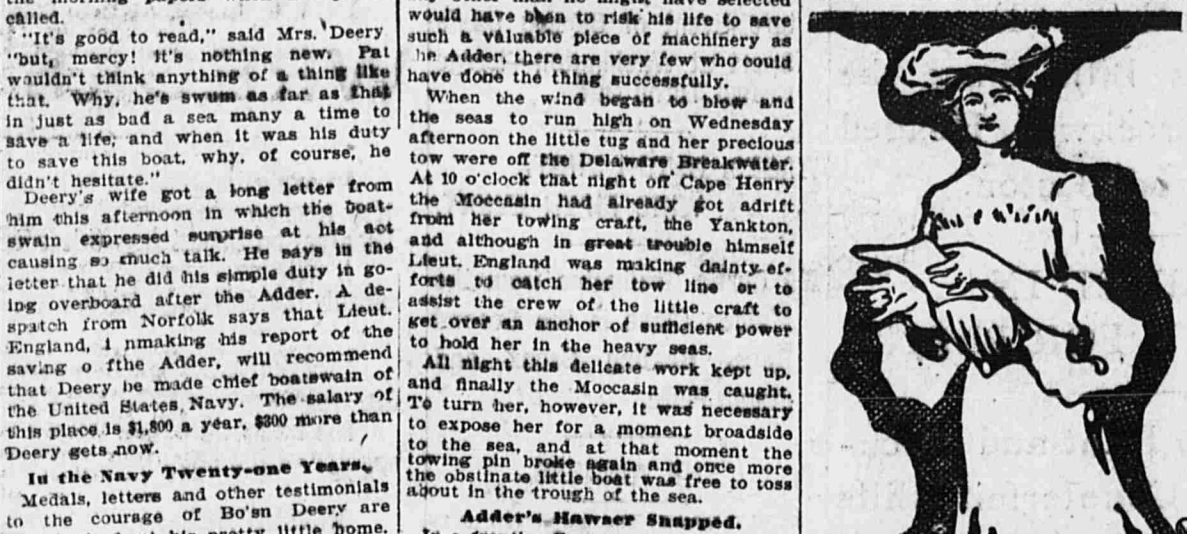

YONKERS, N. Y., Dec. 5.—After singing a lullaby taught her by her mother the four-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George B. Edwards, of No. 15 Randolph street, died last night from the effects of burns. Her mother, who tried to extinguish the flames, was also fatally burned, and is now in a critical condition.
