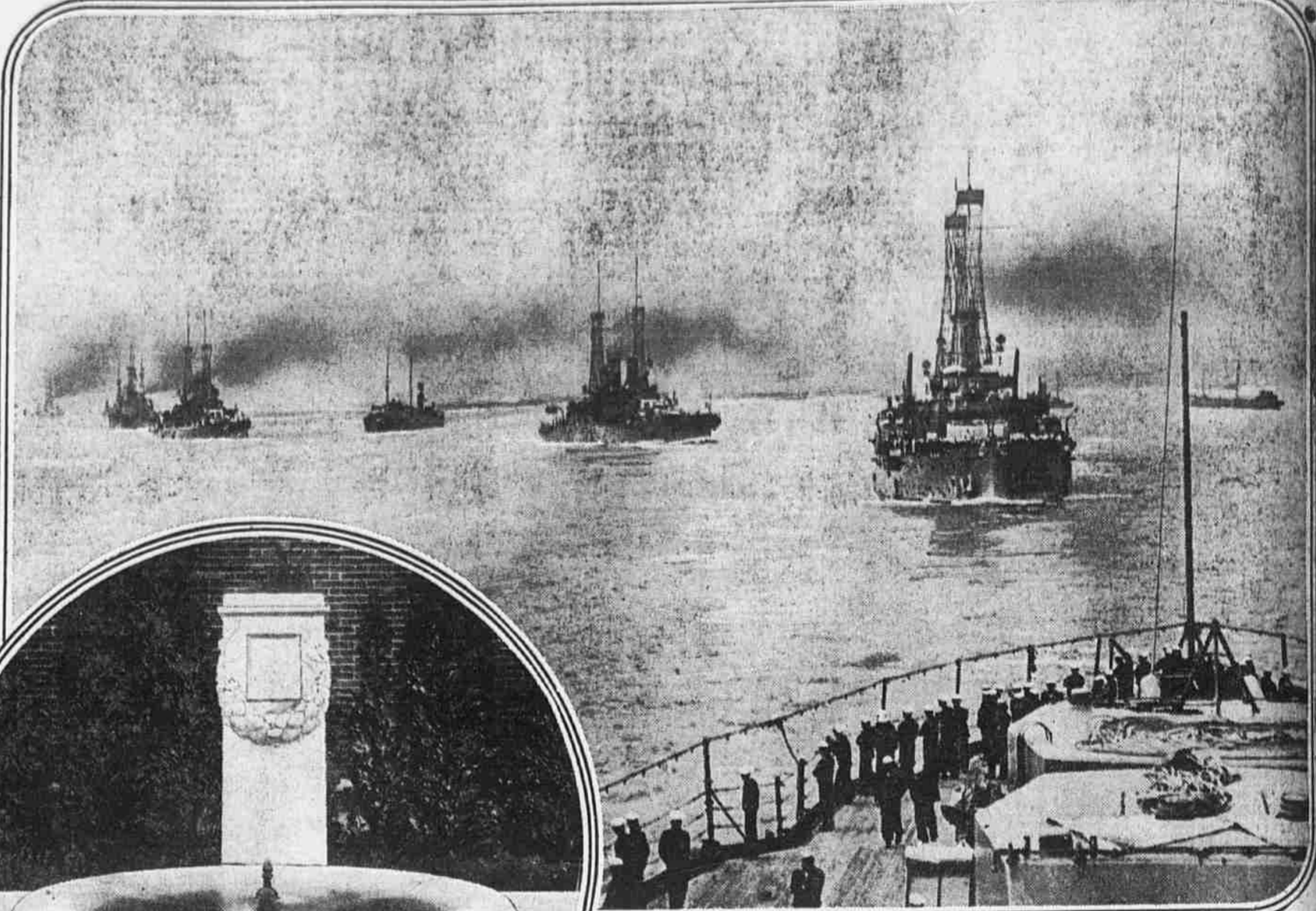

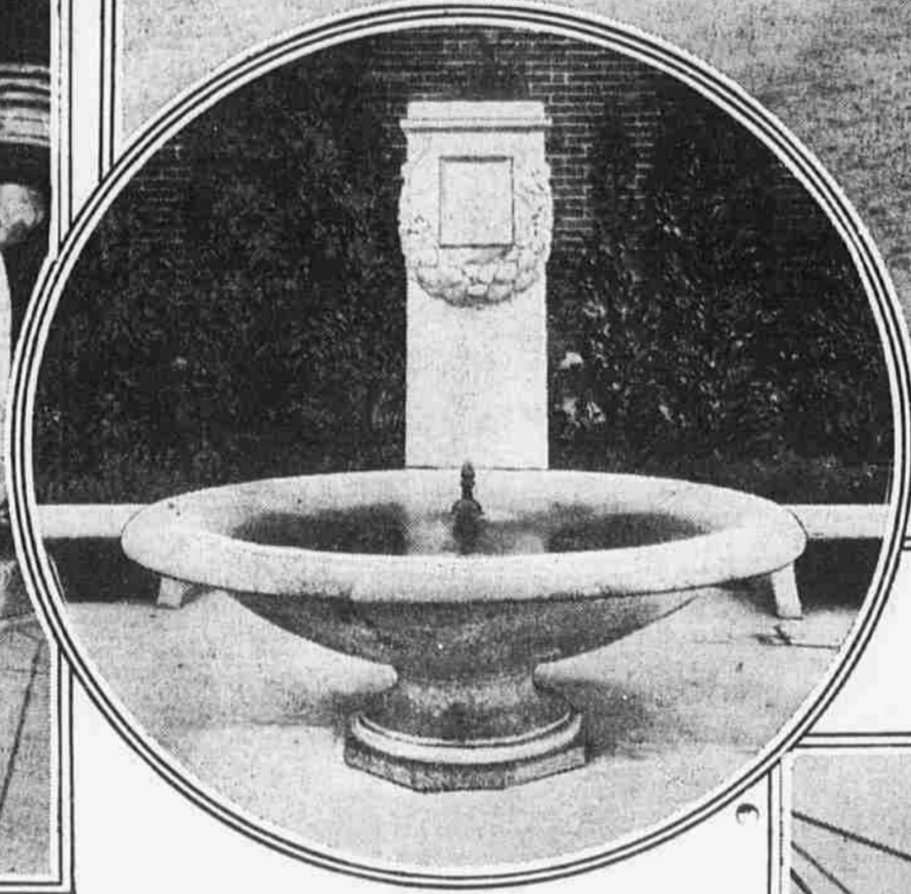

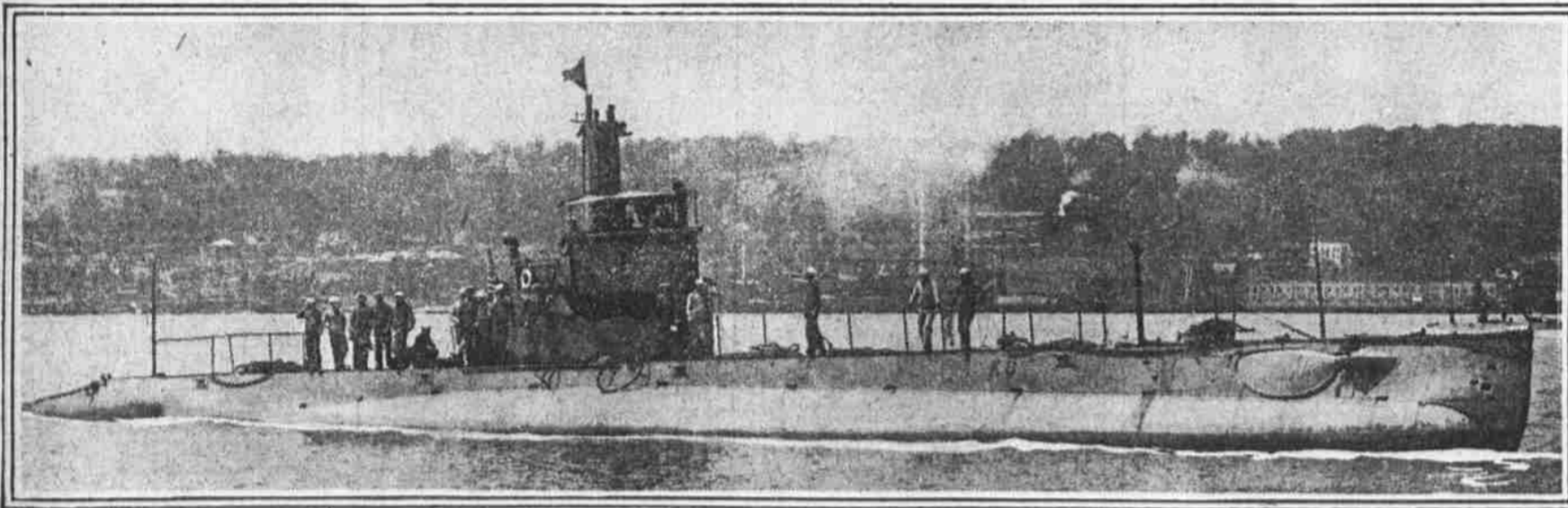

An indication as to why some sailors are perfectly contented to leave their ships when they get to port, instead of staying aboard.

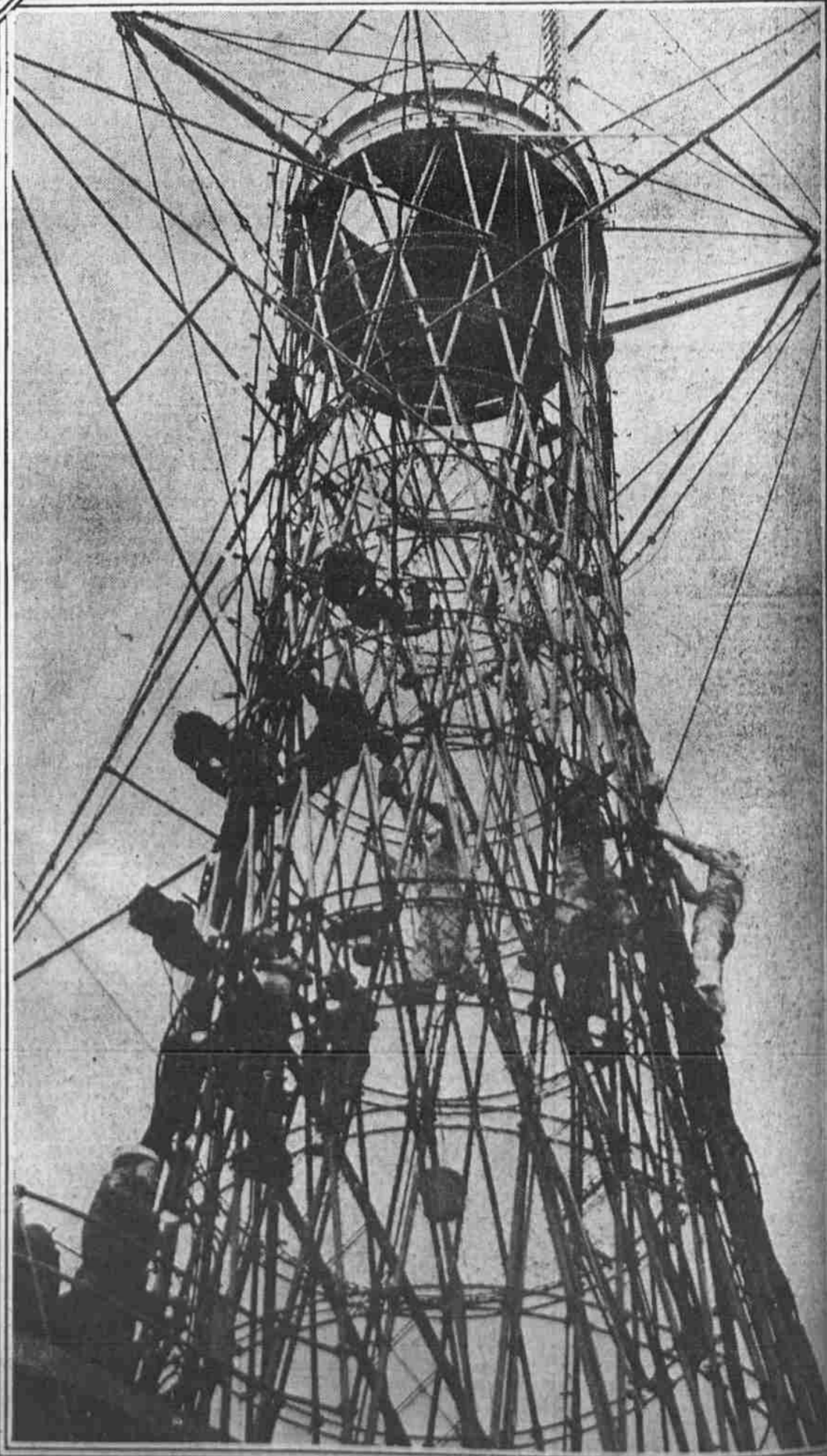
