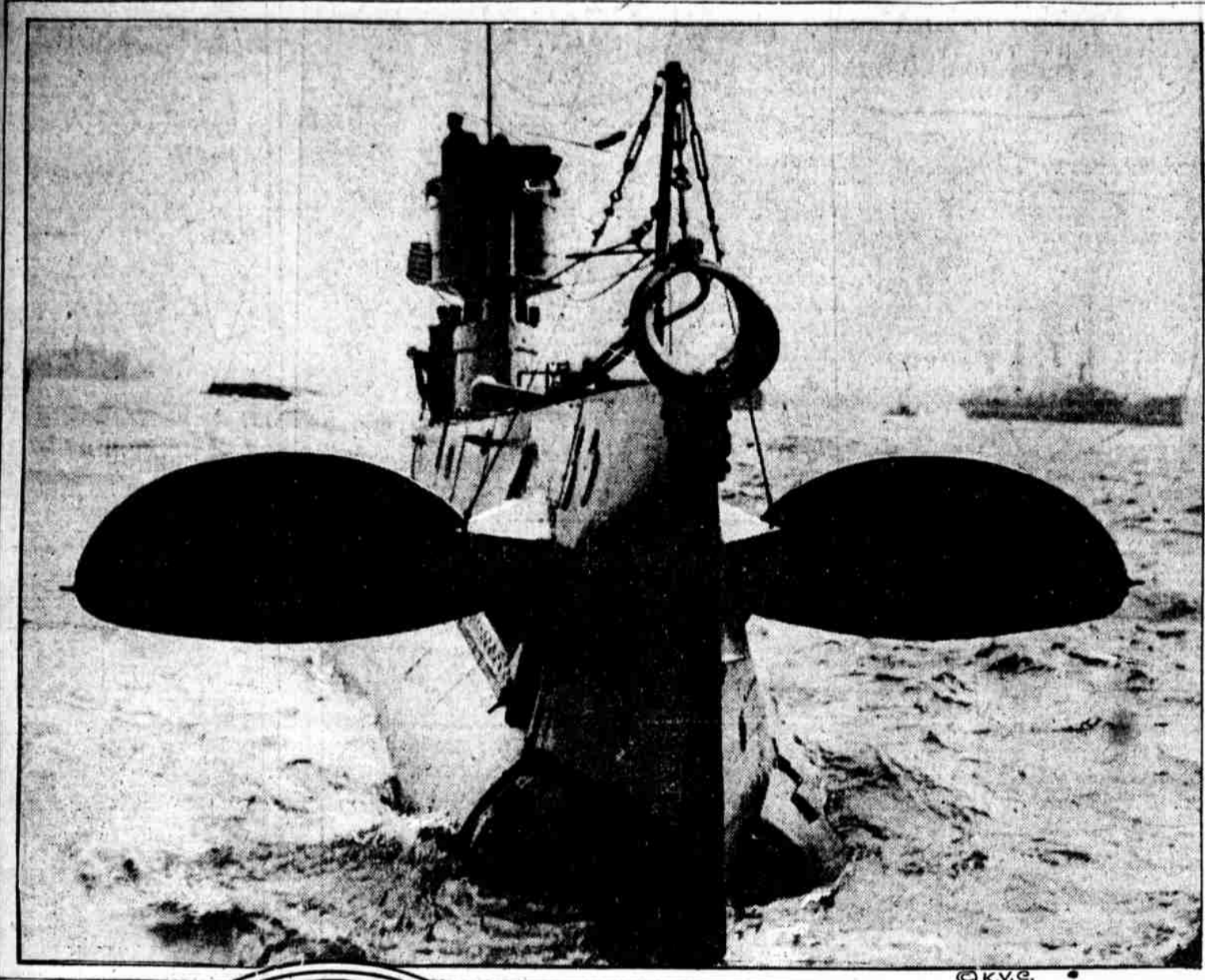


American Submarine Home From War : Exodus of Belgian Refugees : Philadelphia Golfers
