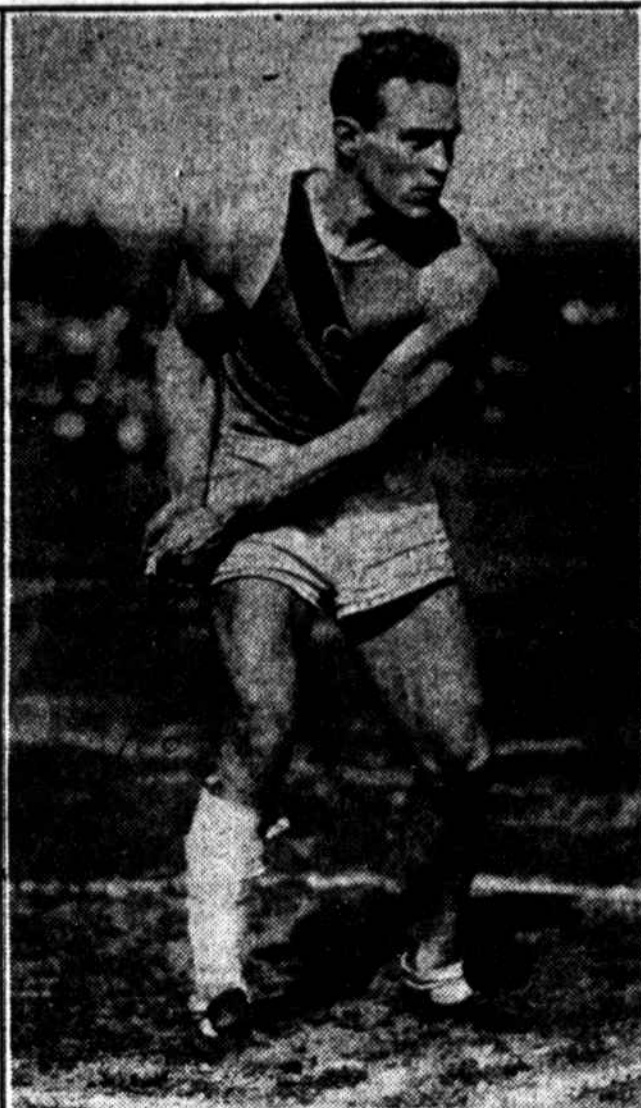
INTERNATIONAL NEWS REEL

BREAKING A RECORD, J. W. Merchant, of the University of California, tossed the hammer 171 feet and 2 inches in the Harvard Stadium.



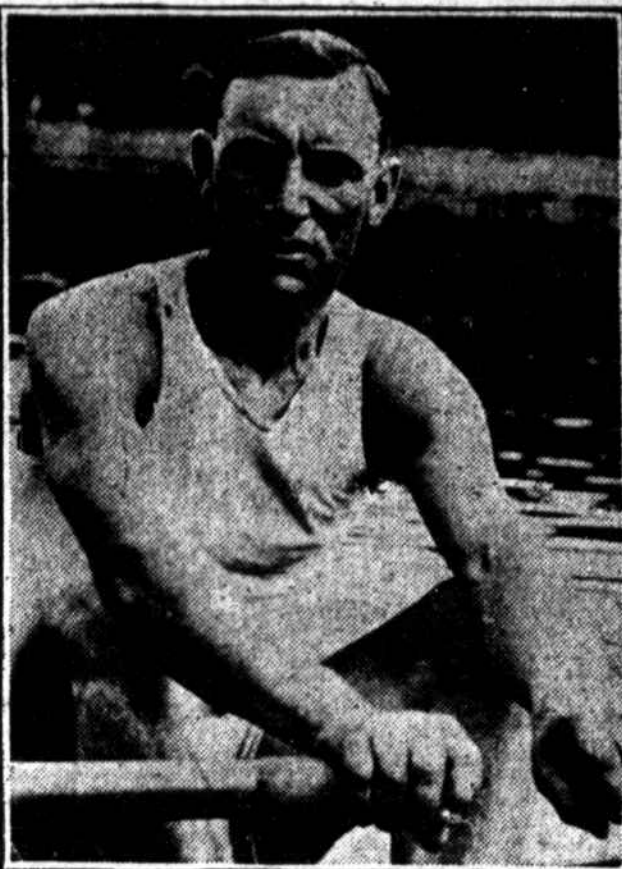

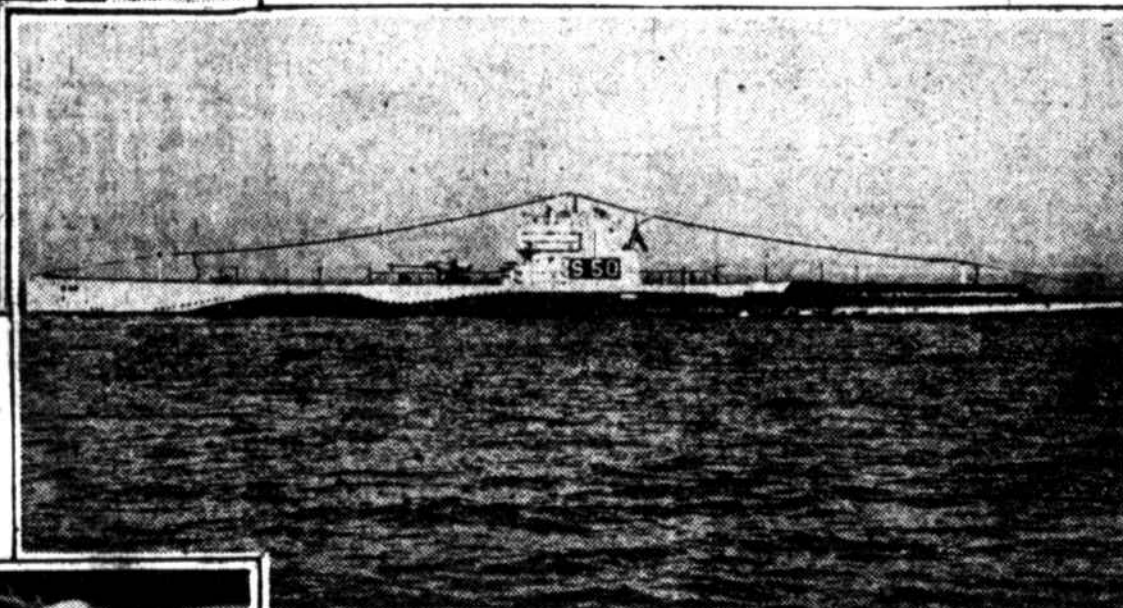
PROBING THE WARD-PETERS MYSTERY in New York, Coroner Fitzgerald is working night and day to ascertain the motive for the murder.
