Detective Ward of Eggers's staff tried to make good against the complaints, and Tom Lee's press agents were there to help him. The Ong Leong Tong is a gambling society-that is, its members like to play fan-tan on holidays. The Hip Sing Tong members don't like the idea of gambling, and they have waged war on the Ong Leong Tong, with the result that now and then a "yellow jacket" is murdered and the District-Attorney's office and the Police Department have to do extra work, all of walch the taxpayer
