Fellow Association Members, Former Sailors, Friends and Family:

I hope this finds all of you in good spirits as we proceed into the Holiday Season and that you all have a wonderful time with family and friends and safe travel wherever you venture. Thanksgiving was wonderful and I am thankful we are at peace in this great Country.

I ask that you take a moment to think of our Navy Sailors (Men & Women) onboard deployed units in harm's way, whether in the Red Sea or the Persian Gulf. These Sailors are on guard for us 24 hours a day. I was on the Yosemite during the war for her last deployment in the Med and Gulf. It turned out to be the last deployment of the Ship. I recall all of us being very focused on our jobs and the reality that mines had been placed in the waters around us and that we were vital to neutralizing, removing, and restoring them to provide physical evidence to our Country in many locations the dangers that were present during the Gulf War.

Our fellow Navy Sailors on deployed units are making it possible for our way of life to continue. I have enclosed a picture of the Yosemite Thanksgiving Day Dinner invitation aboard the United States Ship, the USS Yosemite, from November 23, 1944. Let us be thankful for their efforts when this ship began its service to the fleet.

I am always amazed that the USS Yosemite was in service for 50 years. Having been on the last crew deployed, I can attest that we did not win every competitive award by accident. The ship was in fine material condition with a crew that was inspired to do its very best under the leadership of Capt. Chuck Tuck. We in the Repair Department dedicated ourselves to fixing other ships and ensuring the Yosemite was kept in top Material Condition.

I was incredibly proud to be alongside Cdr. Phil Johnson (Repair Officer) to help us accomplish our overall mission. We were a team led by an experienced and competent professional who knew his people and allowed all of us at every level to do our job, as ARO Production was the name of the game. I attribute my success to the leadership team in place, from the Petty Officers to the Chiefs and Warrant Officers.

In the end, all of us could look back at our time during the Gulf War and know that, from our perspective, things went as well as they could. We were one group, the Crew of Yosemite! Leadership starts at the top. We not only had an excellent CO but two fine XOs as well. LCDR Deborah Salfer was the last XO and was a great sport, tolerating a great deal from the Repair Department. We were, to put it lightly, a very colorful group. It was fitting that she would become the final Commanding Officer. Today, our fellow Sailors are in harm's way as Sailors during the 1944 Thanksgiving. Both the Sailors, now and of yesteryear, are in a very similar situation with a dangerous world around them and the possibility of aggression at any moment. As most of you know, areas like the Red Sea do not give you a lot of warning when a Missile or Drone is coming at your ship from shores that seem far too close to begin with. I can only empathize with those who must be constantly alert 24 hours daily for what might happen next.

All of us who have served on this incredible ship have reason to be proud of the time we served and our devotion to our Navy and Country. It was a time of hard work and long hours with a greater purpose beyond ourselves and the duty of commitment. We must come together as a group and share our past and our stories. So much happens during deployments that the general public does not catalog or know. We keep all that alive as we enlighten one another and relive our best time together. Please join us at our 2025 Reunion.

I hope that as we get closer to our upcoming 2025 Reunion at Charleston, S.C., you will note the dates (23-27 April 2025) and keep your calendar focused on our opportunity to spend time together. I know I


